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Course Description: This training will focus on interviewing children who are victims of maltreatment using the Wisconsin Forensic Interview Guidelines. There will also be some focus on children that witness other violent crimes. The training will include a discussion of the gathering of social history information pertinent to the interview and a brief discussion of offender dynamics as they relate to the child's interview and disclosure. Training incorporates lecture, group activities, discussion, and practice exercises.

Target Audience: This course is intended for child welfare/child protective services workers, law enforcement officers and other professionals involved in the investigation of child maltreatment cases.

WISCONSIN FORENSIC INTERVIEWING GUIDELINES ADVANCED FORENSIC INTERVIEW TRAINING

January 17-19, 2018	Fox Valley Technical College, Appleton
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Course Description: This training will focus on advanced interview techniques including a discussion of interviewing dilemmas and emotional issues that arise in child forensic interviews. This training will consist of brief lecture and discussion and will require the participant to conduct three recorded interviews and a review/critique of each interview.

Target Audience: This course is intended for child welfare/child protective services workers and law enforcement officers who have attended the Basic Forensic Interview Training on the Wisconsin Forensic Interview Guidelines who will be conducting video recorded interviews as part of their job. Preference will be given to those that register a team (CPS and LE) from the same county.
